## Children's Behaviour Policy – 2020-21

### Our school has a Behaviour Policy to:

- Make sure we all behave well in school
- Tell us what will happen if we do not behave well
- Tell us about the rewards we can earn if we behave well
- Make sure we are all treated fairly

### Roles and Responsibilities

**Our Class Teachers** make sure we all behave in a responsible way during lesson time and during break times. Class teachers may contact our parents if they are worried about behaviour. They will tell the Headteacher if parents are contacted.

**Our Teaching Assistants** expect the same high standards of behaviour as class teachers. They work alongside class teachers to make sure good behaviour is maintained around school

**Our Headteacher** will talk to us if we keep behaving in a negative way and may have a meeting with our parents to discuss it. Our headteacher writes about our behaviour in the school behaviour book.

**Our Midday Supervisors** are responsible for our behaviour at lunchtime and will deal with any poor behaviour. They will tell our class teachers if anyone has not behaved well.

**Our Parents** will tell school if they have any concerns about our behaviour and they will come into school for meetings about behaviour if necessary. Parents are invited to attend Celebration Worship each week to see us receive rewards.

**Our Governors** talk to our headteacher about the standards of behaviour in school. They need to know if anyone gets excluded.

### These are our School Rules

- Keep your hands and feet to yourself
- Look after our school environment
- Be honest
- Follow instructions the first time
- Be kind and respectful to everyone

We follow these rules at all times.

### Rewards


We have rewards for when we behave well, work hard or do something special.

**Pride Points** – We earn these by showing excellent learning behaviour. We can save these up and exchange them for gifts from the Pride Shop. These also earn our House a point. At the end of every week, we can earn the Pride certificate that is given out and celebrated in our Celebration Worship on Fridays. We can also win Termly Awards and End of Year Awards.

## Consequences

We have consequences to deal with anyone who does not behave well in school. This might be not doing our best work, not doing enough work, arguing with members of staff, swearing, hurting another person, threatening someone, bullying, bad manners, being dishonest, stealing, damaging property, interrupting, fighting and making racist comments.

Each classroom has a 'Traffic Lights' system to show how we are behaving during the day.



If we break any of the school rules, we will move through the traffic lights. Our teacher will help us to make the right choices. We will have a fresh start back on 'Green' at the start of each day.

If we are on red 3 times in one week, our Head teacher will inform our parents to discuss how we can improve our behaviour.

**Behaviour Incident Forms** – The staff write about more serious incidents (fighting, swearing, continued bullying, damaging property etc.) on a **Behaviour Incident Form**. Our parents may be contacted about this. We might need to go 'On Report' for a week, which is when we have to have a card filled in after each part of the day, to show how we have behaved.

If behaviour is so serious that we make ourselves or someone else unsafe, we may get excluded, which means we are not allowed in school for a number of days decided by our headteacher.
